Background: The Range Grant Citizen Advisory Committee received applications from 14 shooting ranges throughout Idaho for consideration in the FY2024 grant cycle.

The Pittman-Robertson (PR) funding available for FY24 is \$455,000. Fines and forfeiture funding is estimated at \$150,478 and there is \$22,327 in unallocated funds from previous years that are available for FY24, making the total funds available for the year \$627,805.

This year the department set aside 10% of the funding as a contingency to help manage project overages, which have become more frequent in the current construction environment. The department also contracted with a program coordinator who has construction expertise to handle the many day-to-day technical questions from the clubs. The contingency set-aside and the coordinator expense reduce the total funds available to \$538,025.

The committee recommended funding for 23 projects from 13 of the 14 ranges that applied for grants, for a total of \$519,605. The projects come from across Idaho, with six regions receiving at least one recommendation. The committee also proposed the remaining \$18,420 be added to the contingency fund for potential overages.

Director Fredericks reviewed the committee's recommendations and chose to advance all of them as presented for consideration by the Commission. Table 1 is the Director's full list of recommendations to the Commission for the FY24 Range Grant cycle.

Statutory Authority and/or Policy issues: House Bill 396 created authority and policy for the Commission to implement in concert with the Director. Specifically, the Commission is charged with approving Range Grant funding to applicants each year.

Public Involvement Process: The Committee held four public meetings on Jan. 24, Feb. 13, Feb 28, and March 7. All meetings were publicly noticed and open to the public to attend either in-person or via Zoom but were lightly attended.

Staff Recommendation: Proceed with approving funding for FY24 range grant recommendations.

Justification: Implementation of House Bill 396 is necessary to comply with new law.

Recommended Motion: I move the Commission approves the Director's Range Grant Funding Recommendations in Table 1 and the Director retains discretion for assigning the grant funding source.
