BASIS FOR INCLUSION

Lack of essential information pertaining to status; limited distribution and no population trend data.

TAXONOMY

Capnia nedia was described in 1966 and later moved to the genus *Utacapnia*.

DISTRIBUTION AND ABUNDANCE

This species occurs in southwest Idaho and southeast Oregon. The Idaho distribution includes Ada and Washington counties (Nelson and Baumann 1988).

With regard to abundance, Baumann et al. (1977) stated that this taxon is a rare species.

POPULATION TREND

No data are available to describe population trend.

HABITAT AND ECOLOGY

Habitat affiliations have not been documented.

ISSUES

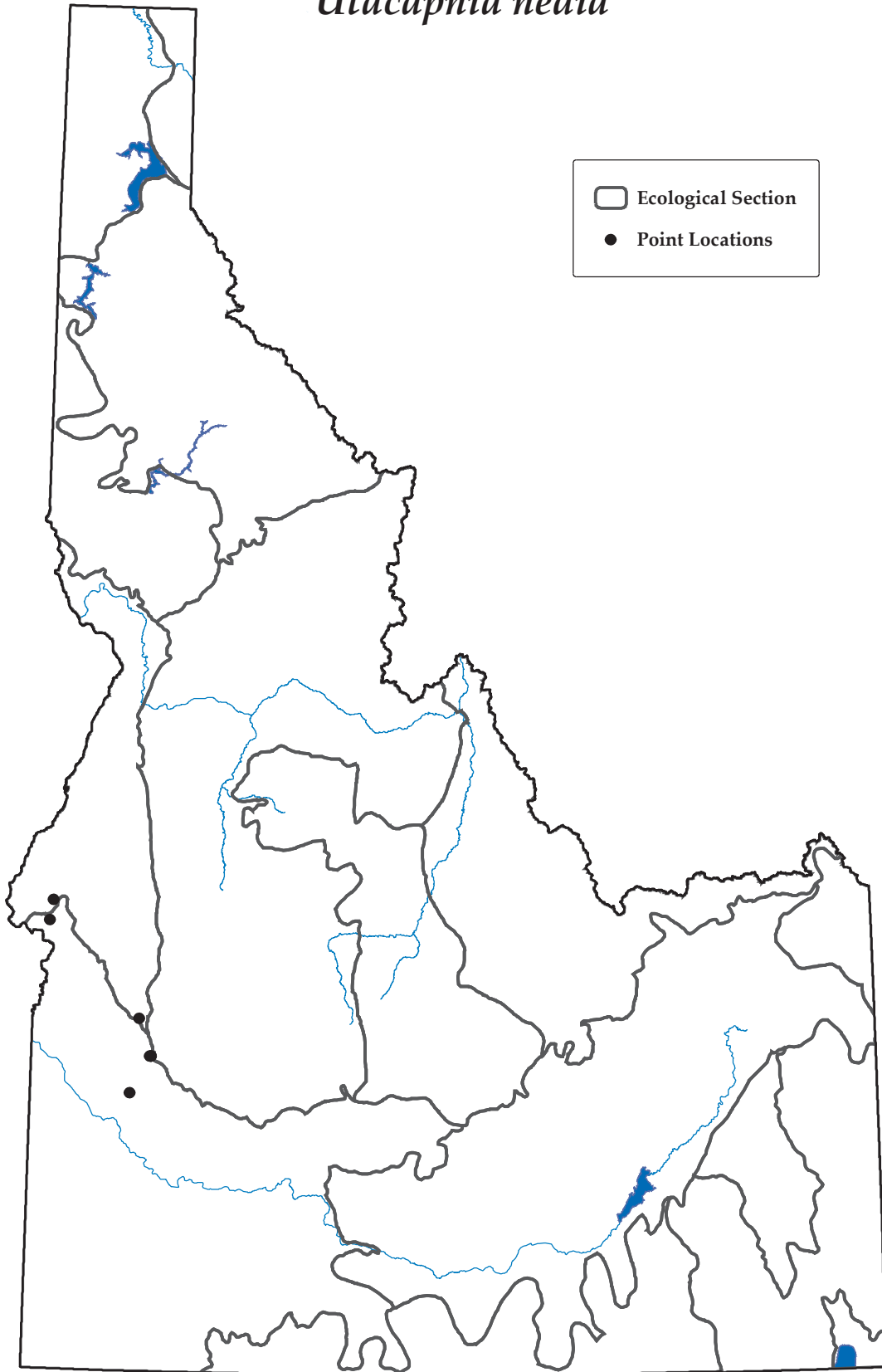
Threats to this species are not known, though any negative changes to aquatic habitats would be potentially threatening to this species.
