BASIS FOR INCLUSION

Lack of essential information pertaining to status in Idaho; Idaho endemic.

TAXONOMY

This species is monotypic.

DISTRIBUTION AND ABUNDANCE

Endemic to Idaho, this amphipod is known only from the mouth of a tributary to the Middle Fork Salmon River, Lemhi County.

POPULATION TREND

No information is available to suggest the size or trend of this population.

HABITAT AND ECOLOGY

This aquatic species has been found in shallow habitat, but details of habitat requirements or other ecological attributes have not been documented.

ISSUES

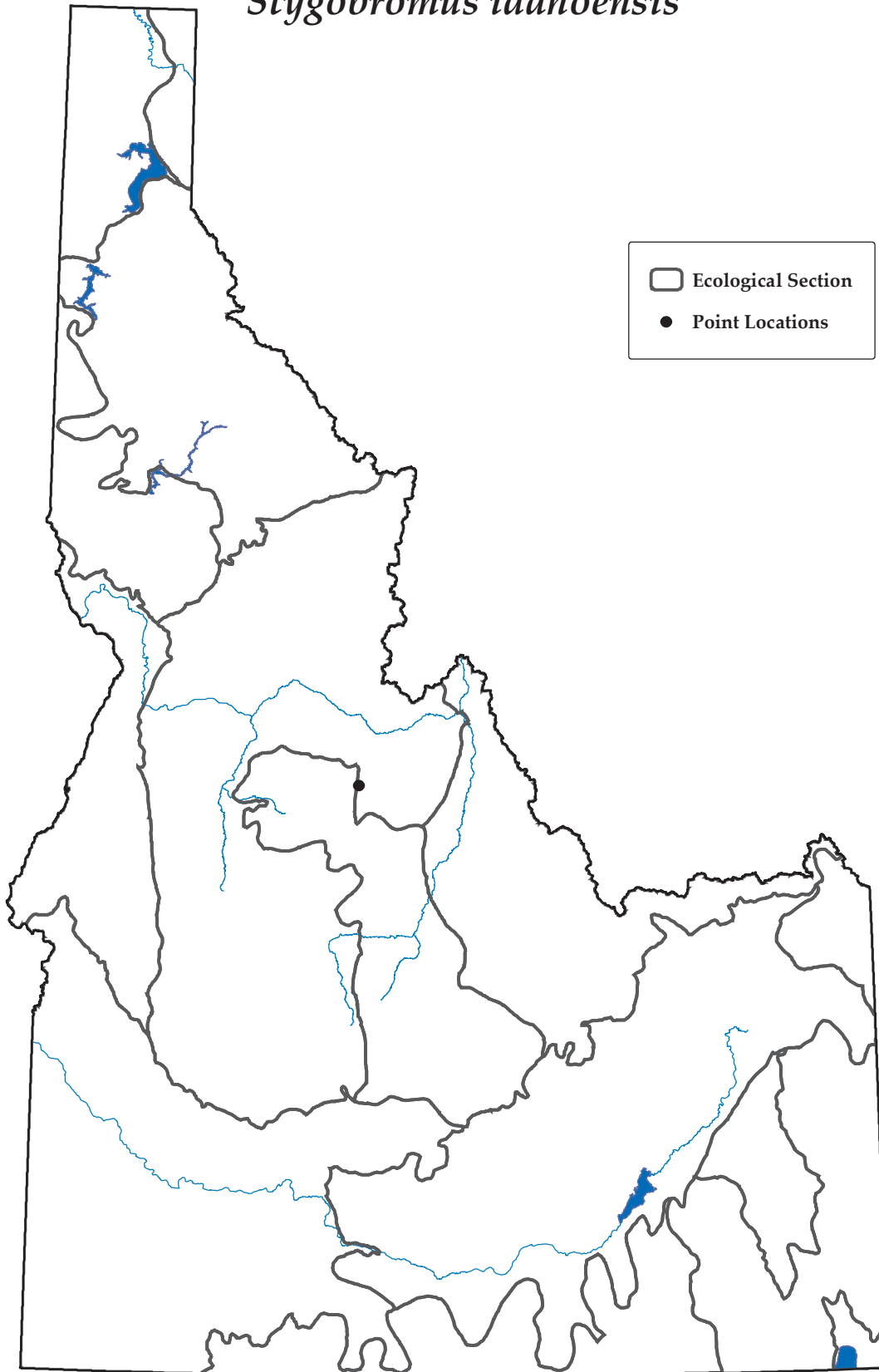
Threats to the population are not specifically identified but could include any changes to the aquatic habitat found at this site.
