

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1. The species of the fish must be certified by a qualified member of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.
2. Location: Fish must have been caught in water open to the general public and within an open season for that species.
3. The fish must be weighed on a certified legal scale. This type of scale can typically be found at grocery stores or US Post Offices. A piece of paper can be placed on the scale to keep it clean. The weighing must be witnessed by (a) two persons other than the applicant or by (b) a Department of Fish and Game employee. The witness(es) must sign the attached application form or a separate statement to the effect that they witnessed the official weight.
4. The official weight shall be at the time of weighing on a certified scale. No provision for weight loss will be allowed.
5. Total length of the fish is a straight line from the tip of the snout to the tip of the tail.
6. Fork length is the length from the tip of the snout to the fork of the tail.



7. Girth of the fish will be measured around the thickest portion of the body.
8. Fish considered for the state records must have been taken by rod and reel or pole and line in compliance with existing fishing rules.
9. Applications must be submitted within 30 days of catch date to be considered.
10. If possible, a photograph or digital picture of the fish should be submitted with this application.
