Permit Provisions:

1. Shooting preserves-must be at least 160 acres in total size and may not exceed one thousand six hundred (1,600) acres (including water area, if any) if the property is leased by the licensee, or four thousand (4,000) acres (including water area, if any) if the property is actually owned by the licensee.
2. Multiple non- contiguous properties/acreages may be combined up to the maximum allowed acres as specified. However, no single acreage or property may be smaller than 160 contiguous acres.
3. No shooting preserve will be licensed if any portion/boundary is within one (1) mile of any state or federal park, wilderness area, refuge or wildlife management area that is more than 160 acres in size and does not allow public hunting. Note, exceptions to this rule may be considered by the IDFG Director if shooting preserve operations will not impact wildlife management goals of said state/federal properties.
4. Applicants are strongly encouraged to check with their local county planning and zoning commission to determine if a shooting preserve operation would be approved under existing county ordinance or land use regulations. A state permit will not supersede county ordinances.
5. Preserve property shall not encompass any public land or limit any existing access to public land.
6. Proposed property will not be licensed if public funds were used to improve or maintain wildlife habitat(s).
7. Boundaries must be posted every 150 feet if not fenced and every 500 if fenced.
