


Q7: The distribution of responses is similar between the state average and the Salmon zone. Hunters in this zone use horse/pack animals somewhat more than other hunters in the state.




Q8: Hunters from the Salmon zone typically use rifles 34.9% more than the state average.




Q11: Harvest success rates for Salmon hunters have tended to be slightly higher than the state average in the past ten years, except for in 2006, 2007, and 2010.


Q14: Similar to the state average, a large majority of Salmon hunters typically hunt in the same zone every year.

Q16: Unlike the state average, hunters in the Salmon zone find a zone that they can get every year as most desirable, while a zone close to home or a cabin is less desirable.




Q20: The Pioneer zone has been hunted the longest among respondents. The Salmon zone itself ranks second in duration.




Q22: Similar to the state average, an overwhelming majority of hunters in the Salmon zone believe that predators are the primary limiting factor for Elk numbers.





TIMES PREFERRED DURING GENERAL ELK SEASON








