






Q3: The range of years of hunting Elk in the Sawtooth zone is smaller than that of the state average. Most hunters have been hunting for less than 40 years.

7. Excluding your travel to and from your home, how often do you use the following mode of transportation when you hunt Elk in Idaho?








Q8: Like state wide hunters, the rifle and compound bow are also the most commonly used weapons for hunters in the Sawtooth zone.




Q10: The reasons for hunting during Elk archery, short-range weapon and muzzleloader seasons have similar distributions between the state average and the Sawtooth zone.

Q11: The harvest success is similar between the Sawtooth zone and the state as a whole. However, success in 2011 is slightly lower for this zone than on average.






Q12: Like other hunters in the state, a majority of hunters in the Sawtooth zone would miss Elk hunting in Idaho a great deal if they could no longer.














Q20: Diamond Creek and Bennett Hills zones have been hunted the longest among respondents. Sawtooth zone itself ranks fifth in duration.




Q22: A vast majority of Sawtooth hunters believe that predators are the primary limiting factor on Elk numbers. That is a 17.2% increase over the state average.


Factor Limiting Elk Numbers





This "capping the zone" is an allocation formula to distribute Elk tags to hunters (residents, nonresidents and outfitted residents) based on the historical use of the previous 5 years. Q25: 91% of Sawtooth hunters have hunted in a capped zone, an almost 50% increase over the state average. Both groups feel similar about how "capping a zone" has affected hunting and caused zone changes.


Q26: Over half of the hunters who have hunted in a capped zone felt that it has made hunting worse. These responses are similar to those at the state level.


Has Hunting Changed in Capped Zone







IMPORTANCE OF REASONS FOR HUNTING ELK IN IDAHO









Q28: The reasons for hunting Elk in Idaho and their importance have similar distributions between Sawtooth respondents and the state average. The top five reasons are the same.








Choose Area With Capped Zone







Feelings About Setting Season Conditions 2 Years in Advance




CHARACTERISTICS AFFECTING CHOICE OF WHERE TO HUNT IN IDAHO












Area Where Can Also Hunt Wolves












IMPORTANCE OF ATTRIBUTES FOR A QUALITY ELK HUNTING EXPERIENCE IN IDAHO











Competing Only With Other Elk Hunters on Foot/Horseback






Number of Hunters Detracted From Quality of Experience



SATISFACTION OF ASPECTS OF 2011 ELK HUNTING EXPERIENCE





40. Do you anticipate Elk numbers to increase now that Idaho Fish and Game is responsible for managing wolves? (*Please check one response*)





Q40: Among Sawtooth respondents, almost a 10% increase over the state average anticipate the number of Elk to increase under IDFG Wolf management.
