- 1) Clarify use of turkey tags in conjunction with a turkey controlled hunt permit
- 2) Align rules with Commission season proclamations for take of red fox in Valley and Adams County
- 3) Allow consecutive possession of annual Hunting Passports for eligible youth until reaching ten years of age
- 4) Exclude moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, and grizzly bear controlled hunt tags from those a parent/grandparent may designate to a child/grandchild
- 5) Integrate Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) risk considerations into IDFG emergency winter feeding decisions
- 6) Prohibit private feeding of deer and elk within any Commission-designated CWD Management Zone
- 7) Restrict possession, import, transport, sale, barter, or trade of live elk, moose and several deer species
- 8) Only allow synthetic liquid scents as attractants for deer and elk
- 9) Restrict import of carcasses and parts of deer, elk, or moose from locations with documented CWD
- 10) Allow certain caliber airguns using pre-charged pneumatic power as a method of take for big game, including in short-range weapon seasons
- 11) Allow hunters 65 and older, or holders of senior combination/disabled combination/nonresident DAV hunting licenses to participate in any second application period for youth-only controlled hunts
- 12) Revise distance for placement of ground sets for trapping furbearing animals, or predatory or unprotected wildlife, from maintained paved/unpaved public trails
- 13) Revise distance for ground sets for trapping wolves from maintained paved/unpaved public trails
- 14) Create administrative framework for the Commission to adopt Landowner Permission Hunt turkey seasons
- 15) Remove mail as a method to submit regular controlled hunt applications.
