DIRECTIONS: *From US 12, between Lewiston and Clarkston, just on the E side of the Snake River, turn S onto Snake River Ave; continue to state park.*

During winter, Bufflehead and goldeneye are common and Bald Eagles can often be found. During the spring/summer, walk the riparian areas along the river or the brushy draws in the uplands for Western Bluebird, Yellow-rumped, Yellow, and Wilson's Warblers, Western Tanager, Black-headed Grosbeak, sparrows, Bullock's Oriole, Sharp-shinned and Cooper's Hawks, Willow Flycatcher, Say's Phoebe, Western and Eastern Kingbirds, and Bewick's Wren. Along the river and at the mouth of Tammany Creek, look for American Avocet, Spotted Sandpiper, and Belted Kingfisher. At the south end of the park, check the rocky bluffs for Rock and Canyon Wrens, White-throated Swift, and five species of swallows. In the hills to the east, look for Red-tailed Hawks and Northern Harrier, as well as Horned Lark, Brewer's, Vesper, Lark, Savannah, and Grasshopper Sparrows.
