DIRECTIONS: *On US 12 in Lewiston, on S side of the Clearwater River Bridge, turn S at traffic light onto 21st St (becomes Thain Rd); continue 4 mi; when Thain Rd becomes two lane, turn L (E) to Powers Ave ~ 5 mi to Mann Lake.*

The best birding spot in the region. Good to excellent birding year round, but especially in fall migration. Quite a few rarities have been found here over the years. Waterfowl are present fall through spring (when ice free) with impressive numbers and variety possible in migration. Locally expected raptor species often present especially Northern Harrier. Peregrine and Prairie Falcons occasional fall through winter. Check the marsh at the base of the dam for Sora and Virginia Rail. Migrant shorebirds are possible July–Nov. depending on lake levels. Uncommon to rare shorebird species can sometimes be found (Short-billed Dowitcher, American Golden-Plover, etc.). American Pipits are common in fall. A nice variety of resident, migrant, and wintering landbirds should not be overlooked. The brushy areas and willows often have migrants (esp. in fall) including warblers, flycatchers, etc. Large numbers of sparrows can be present fall into winter including American Tree Sparrows.
