DIRECTIONS: *From the intersection of ID 78/ID 167 in Grand View, follow ID 167 (Roosevelt Ave.) N 1.5 mi, L (W) into parking lot. Another viewing area can be accessed by continuing N on ID 167 for 0.5 mi, then L (W) on Trueblood Ln for 0.6 mi, viewing platform on L.*

This segment of the WMA is adjacent to the Snake River. Three open water ponds are surrounded by marshes and upland habitat. Ducks, geese, wading birds, and shorebirds can number in the thousands during migration periods. Waterfowl and shorebirds linger until late Dec. or freezeup. Dunlin are regular in late fall/early winter. Virginia Rail almost certainly overwinters here. Sparrows are best viewed in late fall to early spring; winter specialty species include American Tree, Swamp, Savannah, and Lincoln's while Harris's and White-throated don't occur annually but are possible. Winter raptors include Red-tailed, Rough-legged, and Ferruginous Hawk.
