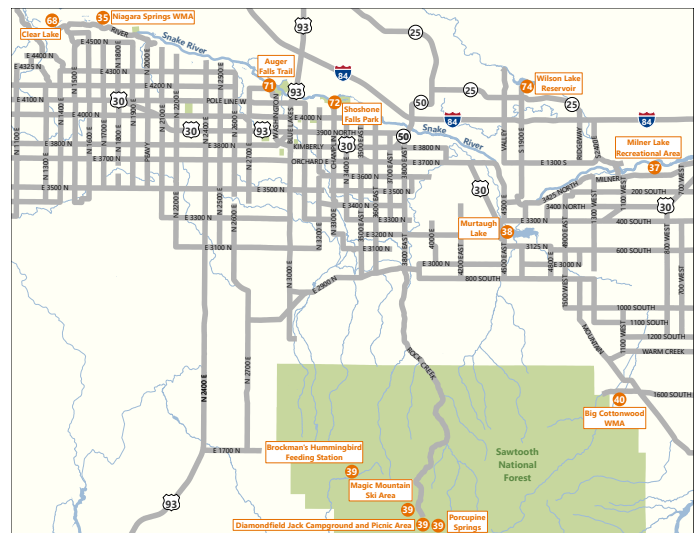
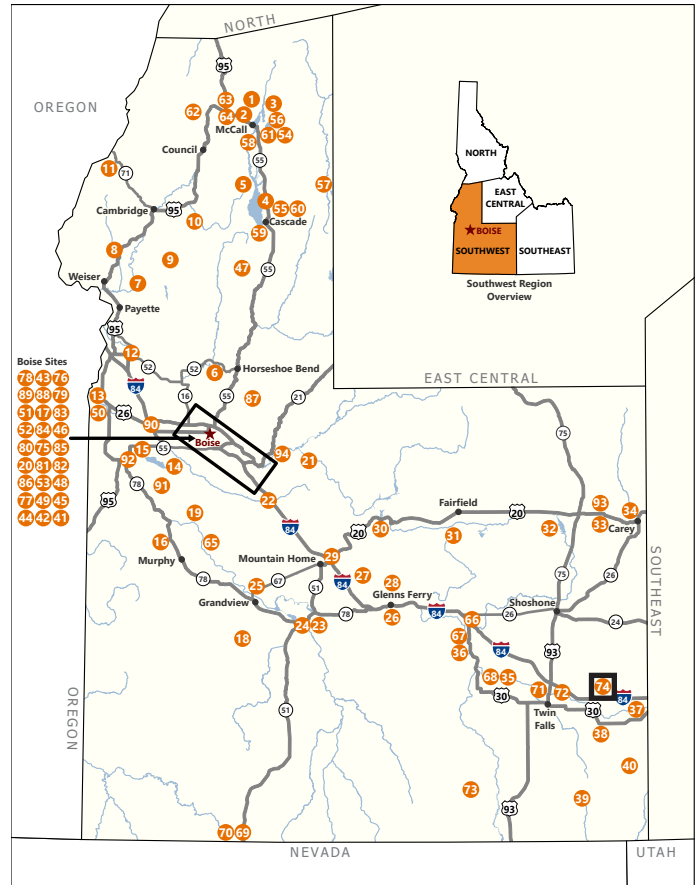

DIRECTIONS: I-84 E to Exit #188 (Valley Rd); L (N) onto Valley Rd for 1.2 mi; R (E) on ID 25 for 1 mi; L on S 1900 E/Murtaugh Rd for 0.8 mi to end of the road to parking area.

Hundreds of Tundra and Trumpeter Swans and Snow Geese take a short break during spring migration here. During the spring, this is a great area to watch Northern Harriers “sky dance.” For gull aficionados, winter is a perfect time to hone your identification skills as hundreds of Ring-billed and California Gulls gather to roost, fun can be had trying to find Herring, Lesser-Black backed, or an Iceland Gull in the mix. As spring approaches Bonaparte and Franklin’s Gulls appear. Bald Eagles are winter/spring visitors and can be seen consuming prey on the ice. Most waterfowl use this area during spring and fall migration. Pied-billed Grebes nest in the cattails.
