STIPULATIONS - PRIVATE POND PERMIT:

1. Pond establishment may require permitting through the Idaho Department of Water Resources and local municipalities.
2. In addition, the privilege of establishing and maintaining a private fish pond is regulated by Idaho state law (36-706, 36-906(a), & 36-906(b) and codes (13.01.11).
3. State laws and rules require owners of private ponds (of their delegates) to secure a permit approved by IDFG before establishing fish populations.
4. Pond inlets and outlets must be screened to prevent fish from entering or leaving the pond.
5. Department staff are required to inspect pond screens and other pond attributes before issuing permits.
6. Private pond permits are valid for five years upon issuance.
7. After a pond permit is approved, pond owners or managers may wish to buy fish from a commercial provider. IDFG will provide a list of approved providers, and owners or managers may schedule live fish delivery by a commercial provider.
8. Permittees collecting fish from the wild in Idaho for live transport must secure an additional permit, must possess a valid fishing license, and adhere to all seasons, limits, and rules. Other legally licensed anglers may assist in collecting fish with the permittee.
9. Illegal release of live fish has serious adverse effects on existing fish populations and on fishing. If you know of or suspect an illegal fish release has occurred or may occur, report it to the nearest Department representative or call the CAP toll-free number: 1-800-632-5999.
