Permit Provisions:

1. Shooting preserves must be at least 160 acres in total size and may not exceed one thousand six hundred (1,600) acres (including water area, if any) if the property is leased by the licensee, or four thousand (4,000) acres (including water area, if any) if the property is actually owned by the licensee.
2. Multiple non- contiguous properties/acreages may be combined up to the maximum allowed acres as specified. However, no single acreage or property may be smaller than 160 contiguous acres.
3. No shooting preserve will be licensed if any portion/boundary is within one (1) mile of any state or federal park, wilderness area, refuge or wildlife management area that is more than 160 acres in size and does not allow public hunting. Note, exceptions to this rule may be considered by the IDFG Director if shooting preserve operations will not impact wildlife management goals of said state/federal properties.

4. Applicants are strongly encouraged to check with their local county planning and zoning commission to determine if a shooting preserve operation would be approved under existing county ordinance or land use regulations. A state permit will not supersede county ordinances.
5. Preserve property shall not encompass any public land or limit any existing access to public land.
6. Proposed property will not be licensed if public funds were used to improve or maintain wildlife habitat(s).
7. Boundaries must be posted every 150 feet if not fenced and every 500 if fenced.
8. Captive bred bird species authorized for use/release are pheasants, gray partridge, chukar, French red-legged partridge, quail (California, bobwhite, gambel's and mountain quail) and grouse (spruce, ruffed, blue, sage, and sharp-tail).
9. A minimum of 200 birds of each species permitted must be released each permit season; imported birds must be certified disease free.
10. Birds released must be marked by leg banding, toe clipping with healed scar or nasal scarring from captive hooding and certified as disease free under standards set forth by the National Poultry Improvement Program.
11. Wild birds taken accidentally must be marked with a band purchased from the Department of Fish and Game.
12. Persons hunting on the preserve must have a valid Idaho hunting license or shooting preserve hunting license.
13. No more than 85% of the total number of each classified game bird species released may be taken. One hundred percent of other exotic species may be taken.
14. A registration book must be maintained listing the names, addresses, hunting license numbers, dates hunted and game taken by sex and species for each hunter.
15. Accurate records of total numbers, by sex and species, of game birds received and the date and numbers released must be maintained.
16. All rearing and holding facilities must be inspected and approved by the Director.
17. The Director or his designee shall be allowed reasonable access to the Preserve to inspect records and hunter bags.
18. Permits are valid July 1 through June 30 (fiscal year).
19. Violation of any provisions relating to the regulation of shooting preserves shall be grounds for revocation of this permit.
